Great California Shake Out

At 10:20a.m. on Thursday, October 20th, millions of Californians, including Edgewater Preschool, will participate in the largest <u>earthquake drill</u>! We will practice Drop, Cover, and Hold.

The Great California Shake Out is held statewide on the third Thursday of October each year. In addition to this large event, the teachers conduct routine earthquake drills in the classroom on a regular basis. <u>Field Trip</u>

The preschool chidlren will be going on a field trip! This field trip is open to **Munchkins, Chipmunks, & Muskrats.** Each child who attends the trip will receive a pumpkin, which will stay at the school until the Fall Festival. Children in the Sprites classroom are welcome to attend the fieldtrip but must be accomponied by an adult. All children must have fully mastered the potty learning process, unless accompanied by an adult. While at the pumpkin patch, the children will go on a train ride, pick out their pumpkin, and go on a hay ride.

All chaperones must submit proof of their pertussis (Tdap), measles (MMR), 2022 flu vaccine (waiver available), and TB test (dated within the last year), and sign a statement of good health (forms available in the office).

The cost is **\$32**/child and **\$25**/adult.

To sign up: pick up a permission slip and submit payment (if by cash or check) by **Friday, October 14th.** Payment can be made by check, cash (exact change) or by using your Tuition Express account. Tuition Express accounts will be processed on <u>Wednesday, October 19th.</u> If you would like to purchase an Edgewater tshirt for your child to wear to the fieldtrip, it may be purchased in the office for \$12 (we accept cash, check, or can be charged to your Tuition Express account).

Fall Festival

On Wednesday, October 26th, our school will be closing at 4pm for our Fall Festival, which will be held from 4pm to 5:30pm. The evening will be filled with fun family activities. Families are invited to bring a pumpkin to decorate. We will have collage materials available. The children will be making a "Friendship Soup" for the event. We are asking each parent to bring in one vegetable of your choice for the soup! Please involve your child in the choosing of the vegetable. The children will be preparing the vegetables for the soup, to be enjoyed during the festival.

Reminder, school will be closing at 4pm, so children must be signed out by an authorized representative before attending the event.

Please plan extra time for pickup and event parking. The green zone in front of the school is for quick pickups; therefore, **if you will be attending an event**, **please park on normal street parking.** Parking in the green zone will only be permitted if arriving after 4pm.

Read for the Record

On Thursday, October 28th children and adults worldwide, including Edgewater Preschool, will participate in the world's largest shared reading experience by reading this year's campaign book, Nigel and the Moon. Nigel and the Moon is about a young boy who dreams big but is too scared to share his dreams with the world. Instead, every night he tells his dream of becoming an astronaut, dancer, and superhero to the moon. As his class moves through career week, Nigel's community helps him build up confidence in who he is. This book encourages children to celebrate where they come from, who they are, and who they want to be. "Read for the Record" is a global campaign that generates public support for high-quality early learning & highlights the importance of building children's vocabulary and love of reading.

TIME CHANGE

On **Sunday, November 6**th, we will change the clocks back one hour. Please be aware that it is normal for children to go through an adjustment period during this time.

For the children who are picked up later from school, please explain to them that it might be dark when you pick them up, as this can be confusing for children. This will reassure them that you will be here to pick them up at the usual time.

Additionally, making some small changes to your child's sleep schedule beforehand can help cushion the transition. To help adjust, it is suggested to gradually shift your child's bedtime earlier in preparation for daylight saving time. For example, if your child goes to bed at 8 p.m., about four days before the time change, put him/her to bed at 7:45 p.m., then 7:30 p.m., and so on until he/she is going to bed as close to 7 p.m. as possible. If possible, wake him/her up a little earlier, as well.
